Friends of Emersons Green Park - General Risk Assessment

Dated: 5th June 2025

General

The activities of the group are focused on two hours volunteering on Thursday mornings plus an annual festival, which has a separate risk assessment. The Thursday mornings are normally taken up with gardening type activities but may also include surveys of the park of various kinds. The group has its own insurance covering both gardening and festival activities.

No power tools are used during volunteer sessions. Any work with power tools, such as a brush-cutter/strimmer is done at a separate time by a trained, certificated person with a banksman and is covered by a separate risk assessment. Mowing, using a small electric battery powered machine may also be done occasionally in the orchard outside of volunteer sessions.

Identified risks relating to volunteer sessions are as follows:

Site Risk assessment

Most of our sessions are conducted in Emersons Green Park. There are few risks associated with this environment. A watercourse runs through the park in association with several pond areas, which are normally less than two feet deep at any point. The watercourse runs at a variable rate and can be strong after rain. The ponds can also rise significantly after intense rain. The group does not normally work near these watercourses apart from the occasional need to fetch water for plant. This is primarily done by using a submersible battery powered pump as this minimises the need to get near the slippery pond edges. This is always done with at least two people. The primary risk from this activity is trips and falls.

We have had bees in the park area and two of our members were stung while working nearby on a previous occasion. If a bee colony is found in the park notices will be put up to warn of the presence of bees and care will be taken in that area, with the general policy being that we will avoid working near where any bees are situated.

The dome village and dinosaur area is under the care of Friends of Emersons Green Park and is monitored regularly for potential risk and a record of these checks kept. Currently the only identified risk is branches becoming dislodged/broken and these providing a threat to eyes.

We occasionally work in other areas including Green Lane, by permission of Emersons Green Town Council and Emersons Green Primary School, as regulated by the school. These sites are assessed for risk prior to commencement of work. e.g. work was carried out in the pond area of Emersons Green Primary School, where the decking was rotting and the area invaded by brambles. Appropriate warnings were given to our members to avoid incidents
